CANADA SENDS ABORIGINALS AS YOUTH AMBASSADORS TO BUSAN, SOUTH KOREA, SEPTEMBER 2004

OTTAWA, August 19, 2004 - TeKnoWave Inc. is pleased to announce that it will be supporting the growing Canadian and First Nations participation in the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Asia Telecom which will be held in Busan, Republic of Korea, from September 7 to 11, 2004.

TeKnoWave students, Angela Vallely, Cree, from Fisher River, Manitoba and Philip Vanevery-Albert, Cayuga from Six Nations, Ontario will travel to Korea as members of the Canadian business delegation led by Government of Canada officials. Ms. Vallely and Mr. Vanevery-Albert will serve as youth ambassadors at the Canadian Pavilion and will gain valuable business, trade and international relations experience. They will also participate in the second ITU Asia Youth Forum. The goal of the Forum is to cultivate the business and government leaders of tomorrow as they address critical digital divide issues – ICT literacy, access to technology and cultural issues.

"TeKnoWave is honored to be chosen and to represent Canada at the ITU Asia", says Rima Aristocrat, President of TeKnoWave Inc. "TeKnoWave is an exciting Canadian initiative with a proven track record for training Aboriginal youth in Information Communications Technology. It is our hope that other countries with significant Indigenous populations could look at TeKnoWave as a model to blend capacity building in Technology with economic development opportunities".

"Through the cooperation of the Government of Canada and private sector partners, these young people will have the opportunity to raise awareness of Aboriginal enterprise, building on the very successful Canadian Aboriginal contribution to the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) in Geneva last December. Mohawk Internet Technologies (MIT) of Kahnawake, Canada's largest Aboriginal owned internet service provider is pleased to sponsor and provide the opportunity for the two Aboriginal youth to attend the ITU Telecom Asia 2004. For the past year, Ms. Vallely and Mr. Vanevery-Albert have been studying information technology and business as students in the TeKnoWave program at its Ottawa campus. TeKnoWave is Canada's first national program focused exclusively on building technical capacity within Canada's Aboriginal peoples and communities. TeKnoWave offers a unique blend of training in technology and business, community projects to gain valuable experience, international diplomas, transferable university credits and mentorship from the private sector.

ITU is the United Nations organization responsible for telecommunications and technology applications, with headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. The Telecom conferences and exhibitions are one of its core programs. Telecom Asia will be attended by 20,000 visitors from industry and government from 122 countries and will have 319 exhibitors from 24 countries. The Youth Forum has 100 delegates from 40 countries.
